### Laboratories

- < 2 weeks
- rRT-PCR
  - Real-Time ReverseTranscription-Polymerase Reaction
- Trioplex
  - Authorized by the FDA under the Emergency Use Authorization (EUA)
  - Distinguishes between ZIKA, Dengue & Chikungunya
  - > 2 weeks IgM
- No IgG tests available
- Rapid office test under evaluation





### Support Management

- · Antipyretics
- · Analgesics
- · Antipruritie

Avoid spreading the virus Family Orientation Evaluation according to Bright Futures Registry for ZIKA + children






