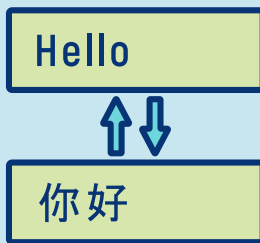


Translation and Interpretation

What's the difference?

Translation involves written words.



Translators write. They change written words from one language to another.

Interpretation is about spoken language.



Interpreters talk or sign. They help people communicate when they speak different languages, including sign language.

What is a medical interpreter?

A certified medical interpreter is a bilingual or multilingual person who is responsible for providing real-time translations to patients and their family members.

Their work helps bridge the communication gap between physicians and patients who do not share a common language.

Types of interpretation



Phone interpretation

Appointment with provider while the interpreter is on the phone



Video interpretation

Appointment with provider while the interpreter is on video



In-person interpretation

Appointment with provider while the interpreter is with you
