Representation Domain



Engage families who represent the diversity of the community your organization serves. Consider including higher numbers of families from communities that experience the most disparities in care and health outcomes.

Know the population data.

Use internal and external data sources to understand the demographics on the populations your organization serves and the needs of the surrounding communities.

Connect with family-led organizations and community-based organizations to recruit and support family partners.

Offer training.

Provide opportunities for family partners and staff to build their skills. Learning opportunities might include:

- Workshops about family-professional partnerships and family engagement.
- Training about implicit bias so all participants are aware of how the assumptions they may make can affect whether we create equitable policies.
